Main access routes (time required may change depending on traffic.)

Please refrain from driving to the venue.  
The most convenient means of access is by train and bus.

## JR Keiyo Line Route

■ Tokyo Stn. JR Keiyo Line(direct) Kaihimmakuhari Stn. (5min, on foot)  
■ Tokyo Metro Yurakucho Line Shin-Kiba JR Keiyo Line Kaihimmakuhari Stn. (5min, on foot)  
■ Yurakucho Stn. 12 min. Stn. 21 min.

■ It is also possible to change from the JR Musashino Line (direct to Kaihimmakuhari Stn. or change to JR Musashino Line at Minami-Funabashi) to the Keiyo Line. The Tokyo Metro Tozai Line connects to the JR Musashino Line at Nishi-Funabashi Stn.

■ Limited express trains (Wakashio, Sazanami) are scheduled on a special timetable during the Show period.

## JR Sobu Line Route (10min,shuttle bus ride from Makuharihongo Stn.to the venue)

■ Tokyo Stn. JR Sobu Line Tsudanuma Stn. Makuharihongo Stn. (10min, on paid shuttle bus)  
■ Akihabara Stn. 31 min. on rapid train JR Sobu Line 4 min. on local train Makuharihongo Stn. (10min, on paid shuttle bus)  
■ It is also possible to change from the JR Musashino Line and Tokyo Metro Tozai Line to the JR Sobu Line at Nishi-Funabashi.

## Keisei Line Route (10min,shuttle bus ride from Makuharihongo Stn.to the venue)

■ Keisei Chiba Line 32 min, on limited express train 3 min. (10min, on paid shuttle bus)

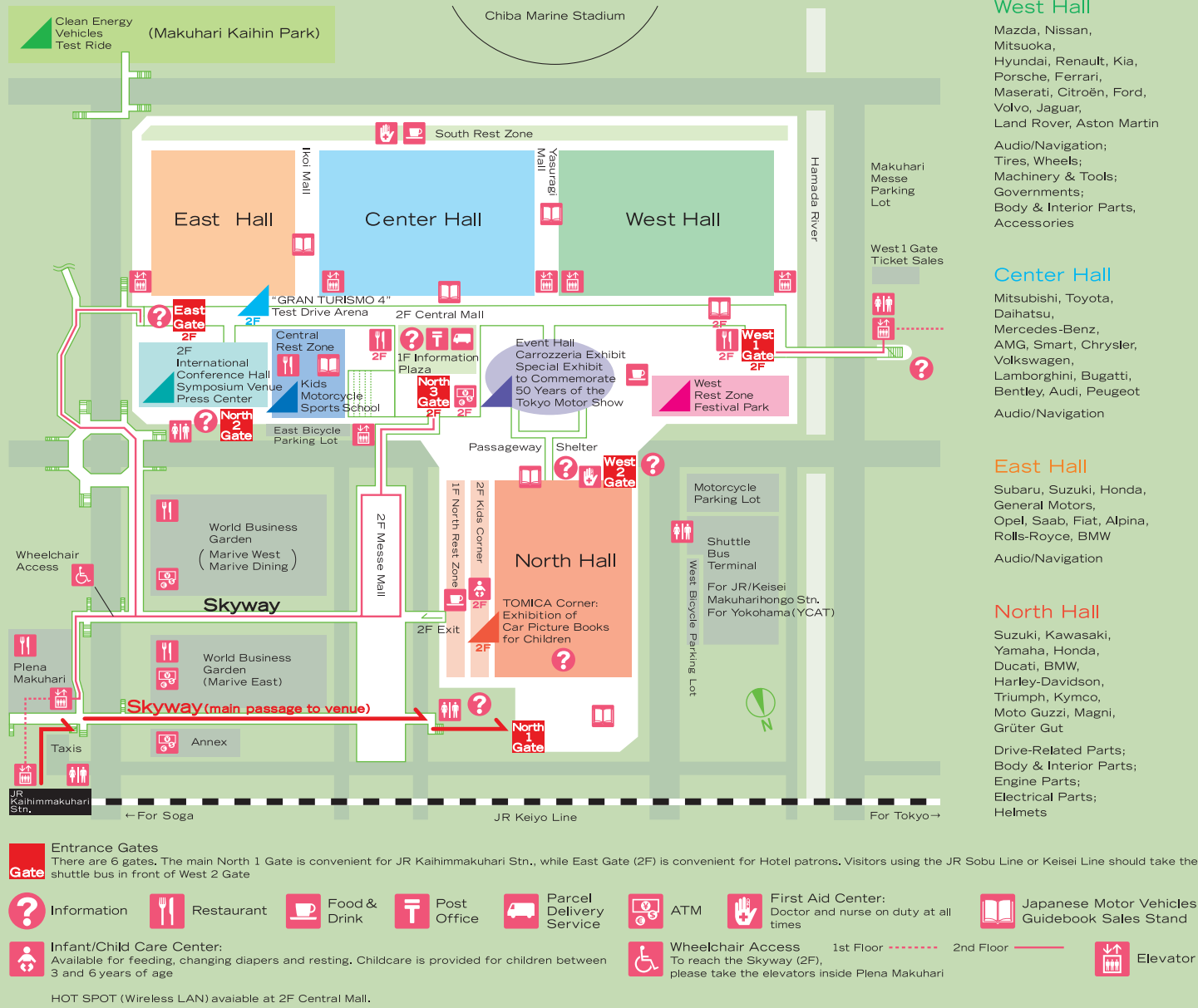
